**I. Announcement from Pat Olsen:**

Pat Olsen (1<sup>st</sup> quarter instructor) shared the curriculum committee's findings on a review of current Nursing Diagnosis handbooks. The curriculum committee has reviewed a variety of Nursing Diagnosis textbooks to possibly replace Carpenito. Among those reviewed were books by Ackley/Ludwig and Doenges/Moorehouse/Murr.

The results of the committee's review found that Carpenito was the strongest textbook of those available. The decision was made to keep Carpenito as the Nursing Diagnosis text book.

Ackley was found to be too "cookbook" and not culturally competent. Doenges is newer, a little simpler to use, and clusters the nursing diagnoses with medical diagnoses.

Carpenito was found to be the best fit for the Shoreline curriculum because it "doesn't do the thinking for you" and it not only shows you the way a nursing diagnosis should be written, but it also shows what not to do.

To supplement understanding the nursing process a new textbook, available in August, will be added to the supplemental, or optional, reading lists called Understanding *the Nursing Process* by Carpenito. This is billed as a sort of "Nursing process for dummies" (this was said with the knowledge that, of course we are not dummies, but

that the nursing process can be a complicated concept to grasp in the beginning). The faculty has ordered this text for fall quarter.

## II. Red Cross Nursing Student

Niki Kirby (5<sup>th</sup> quarter student) shared information regarding guidelines for nursing student involvement in the American Red Cross. The American Red Cross has a special program for student nurses. After 10-hours of volunteer work, students receive a student nurse pin. After graduation volunteers are pinned as a Red Cross Nurse. Student nurse volunteers can take and teach Red Cross classes such as HIV/AIDS & First Aid, participate in leadership activities such as Red Cross Committees or College Student Nurse Representative, participate in support services such as public relations or fundraising, or provide direct services such as disaster preparedness or transportation programs. There are also scholarship awards and school awards available.

Anyone interested in participating in the Red Cross should go to [www.redcross.org](http://www.redcross.org) and click on Nursing then Student Nursing. The hope is that someone from our program would become a Red Cross Student Nurse Representative.
