### ASSOCIATE IN ARTS – DIRECT TRANSFER AGREEMENT (AA-DTA)

The AA-DTA, known as the direct transfer degree, is an agreement between Washington State community colleges and baccalaureate institutions. The AA-DTA transfers as a package to most baccalaureate colleges and universities in Washington, satisfying most, if not all, of the lower division general education requirements and granting junior standing; it does not guarantee admissions. The AA-DTA requires 90 quarter credits in college-level courses numbered 100 or above with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. In addition, this Communications transfer guide identifies specific courses to take within the degree to help students prepare for entrance into baccalaureate majors. **See the reverse side for a complete listing of courses that fulfill general education and distribution requirements**
